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Review Highlights

Review of Funds
Administered by District Attorneys General
and
Judicial District Drug Task Forces
First Through Thirty-First Judicial Districts
For the Year Ended June 30, 2005

Scope

Our review included an examination of funds administered by the district attorneys general for the year ended June 30, 2005. In addition, our review included an examination of judicial districts' drug task force funds administered by the task forces' boards of directors for the year ended June 30, 2005.

Results

Ten judicial districts had findings. We reviewed these findings and recommendations with the district attorneys general and representatives of the Drug Task Forces. Details of these findings, recommendations, and management's responses, as a result of our examination, are presented in the Findings, Recommendations, and Financial Section of this report

The following are summaries of the findings from our review:

FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- ◆ The Drug Task Force did not deposit collections with the county trustee within three days of receipt.
- Agents' activity reports were not signed as evidence of review and approval.

THIRD JUDICIAL DISTRICT

• Payments to confidential informants were not witnessed by a second officer.

EIGHTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

The Drug Task Force did not deposit receipts within three days of collection.

NINTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

◆ The Drug Task Force (DTF) paid compensation to an employee of the District Attorney General's Office directly from DTF funds instead of transferring the funds to the District Attorneys' General Conference to be disbursed through its payroll system. Furthermore, the DTF did not deduct payroll taxes from this compensation.

TENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- ♦ The Drug Task Force (DTF) Fund had a cash shortage of \$4,520 at June 30, 2005. This shortage resulted from the DTF being unable to account for certain cash being held as evidence (\$3,200) and confidential investigative funds (\$1,320).
- ♦ The DTF Fund had numerous accounting deficiencies. Official receipts were not issued for all collections, required by state statutes. Cash held as evidence was not deposited in a timely manner. Confidential investigative funds were not routinely counted and reconciled by the director of the DTF. The director transferred \$3,410 in seized funds directly to confidential investigative funds rather than depositing the funds with the county finance office. Monies received for contributions (\$2,300) and interest earnings (\$1,906) were deposited into a checking account maintained by the DTF director instead of being deposited with the county finance office. The DTF director used funds maintained in the checking account of \$1,672 to purchase equipment and other items for use by reserve officers.

TWELFTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Deficiencies were noted in Drug Task Force (DTF) expenditures. Original documentation was not on file in the County Mayor's Office to support some expenditures. Also, DTF funds were used to pay the monthly cellular telephone bills of an assistant district attorney.
- Several law enforcement agencies participating in the interlocal agreement did not contribute to the operations of the DTF.
- ◆ The Board of Directors of the DTF did not assume sufficient oversight responsibility for the task force's operations.
- Payments to confidential informants were not witnessed by a second officer.

THIRTEENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- ◆ The District Attorney General's Office did not maintain adequate controls over its assets. In several instances, equipment was not tagged or clearly marked as property of the District Attorney General's Office.
- ◆ In some instances, purchase orders were not issued for some applicable purchases. Also, competitive bids were not solicited for the design and printing of methamphetamine drug education handbooks (\$67,295) or for protective gear and equipment (\$32,835).

THIRTEENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT (CONT.)

- Several Drug Task Force (DTF) assets were not tagged or clearly marked as task force property. Also, we were unable to verify the existence of six portable radios, an exercise machine, a night vision scope, and a printer that were listed on the equipment inventory.
- ♦ The DTF did not monitor a subrecipient of grant funds to ensure that the federal funds were used in accordance with grant guidelines.

TWENTY-SECOND JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- ♦ The receipts for some payments to confidential informants were not signed by the agent or the informant and were not witnessed by a second officer.
- The Drug Task Force was unable to account for 27 pieces of equipment listed on the prior-year inventory but not listed on the current year inventory. These unaccounted for items included a pager, four radios, two radio chargers, two tape recorders, a camera, a radar system, a night vision scope, a video camera, and various tools.

TWENTY-FOURTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- ◆ The Drug Task Force (DTF) did not deposit seized funds that were awarded to the DTF with the county trustee on a current basis.
- ◆ The Board of Directors of the DTF did not assume sufficient oversight responsibility for the task force's operations.

THIRTY-FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

♦ The Drug Task Force (DTF) expended \$2,170 for training and travel for the district attorney general relating to the investigation and prosecution of drug and violent crimes and paid the monthly cellular telephone service for the district attorney general and three assistants. State statutes require the DTF to use drug fines and forfeitures exclusively for drug enforcement or drug education.

INTRODUCTION

This is a report of our review of funds administered by District Attorneys General and Judicial District Drug Task Forces for the year ended June 30, 2005, for the first through the thirty-first judicial districts of the State of Tennessee. A separate review was conducted in each of the 31 judicial districts of the funds administered by the District Attorneys General and Judicial District Drug Task Forces. The results of our reviews of the judicial districts are presented in this report.

BACKGROUND

Each judicial district comprises from one to seven counties. Main offices are generally in the county where the district attorney general resides, with branch offices located in other counties. The district attorneys general had funds on deposit with some county trustees of the counties included in the respective judicial districts. The county trustees had one or more of the following types of funds on deposit: District Attorney General, Judicial District Drug, Federal Asset Forfeiture, DUI Task Force, Metro/County Appropriations, Safe Neighborhood Grants, Mediation Services Fund, and Other Funds.

District Attorney General Fund

The District Attorney General Fund is used primarily to account for fees received from the Fraud and Economic Crimes Prosecution Act of 1984. In addition, this fund is also used to account for other sources of revenues received by the District Attorneys General, such as: investment income, miscellaneous refunds, copy fees, contributions, proceeds from confiscated property, and other local revenues.

Drug Task Force Fund

Some judicial districts have established multi-jurisdictional drug task forces under the leadership of the district attorneys general. These drug task forces were created by contract (mutual aid agreement) between the participating district attorneys general, city and county governments, and approved by their respective legislative bodies. Each judicial district drug task force, except for the Thirty-First Judicial District Drug Task Force, is governed by a board of directors, which generally includes sheriffs and police chiefs of participating law enforcement agencies within each judicial district. The Thirty-First Judicial District Drug Task Force is governed by the district attorney general.

Drug task force funds are to be deposited with the county trustee in the county of each district attorney general's residence or another county designated by the district attorney general. The county trustees should credit these funds to a Judicial District Drug Fund.

All nonconfidential financial operations should be expended through these Judicial District Drug Funds under the administration of the county mayors/executives. The directors of the drug task forces should submit requisitions to the county mayors/executives for goods and services, which would then be obtained through the county's purchasing system. Cash transactions for confidential funds should be requisitioned and disbursed under the supervision of each drug task force director and chairman.

Federal Asset Forfeiture Fund

In 1984, the United States Department of Justice enacted the Comprehensive Crime Control Act, which gave the Office of U.S. Attorney General the authority to share federally forfeited property with cooperating state and local law enforcement agencies. The three primary goals of the Justice Department's forfeiture program are to punish and deter criminal activity by depriving criminals of property used for or acquired through illegal activities; to enhance cooperation among federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies through equitable sharing of assets recovered through the program; and to procure revenues to enhance forfeitures and strengthen law enforcement.

Through an agreement with the United States Department of Justice and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), the Office of District Attorney General of the Thirtieth Judicial District is participating in this forfeiture program. Under this agreement, the District Attorney General's Office has assigned to the Drug Task Force (DTF) an officer who is under the direct supervision and control of DEA supervisory personnel. Upon request by the District Attorney General's Office, DEA reimburses for overtime payments made to the officer assigned to the DTF. The District Attorney General's Office deposits these reimbursements with the Shelby County financial director, who channels the funds through Shelby County's General Fund. Also, under this agreement, the District Attorney General's Office requests from DEA its share of property recovered through joint law enforcement activities in which the officer assigned to the DTF participates. Payments received are deposited with the Shelby County Trustee's Office into the U.S. District Attorney General Federal Asset Forfeiture Fund. Pursuant to Department of Justice policy, funds made available through this program must be used by the District Attorney General's Office for law enforcement purposes.

Through an agreement with the Internal Revenue Service, the Office of District Attorney General of the Twentieth Judicial District is also participating in the forfeiture program. Payments received by the Twentieth Judicial District are deposited to a separate fund in Metro-Nashville Davidson County and must be used for law enforcement purposes.

DUI Task Force Fund

The DUI Task Force Fund consists of DUI district fines received by the Twenty-First Judicial District.

Metro/County Appropriations Fund

The Metro/County Appropriations Fund consists of funds appropriated by the counties and cities in the Twenty-Third Judicial District.

Safe Neighborhood Grants Fund

The Safe Neighborhood Grants Fund consists of federal grant funds received by the Thirtieth Judicial District for use in a marketing campaign to reduce community gun violence.

Mediation Services Fund

The Mediation Services Fund consists of funds received from a one dollar litigation tax that is assessed on all cases in the General Sessions and Juvenile Courts in Davidson County and other appropriations received by the Twentieth Judicial District for the support and operation of victim-offender mediation centers.

Other Funds

Other funds reflected in the Sixth Judicial District consist of grants from the Office of Criminal Justice Programs, including Edward Byrne Memorial Grants and matching funds from Knox County. Other funds in the Eighth Judicial District consist of a Community Prosecution and Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant passed through the City of Knoxville. Other funds in the Tenth Judicial District consist of funding from a Community Prosecution and Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant received from the U.S. Department of Justice, an Edward Byrne Memorial Grant passed through the state Office of Criminal Justice Programs, and local matching funds. Other funds in the Thirtieth Judicial District consist of funds raised from contributions for a 5K run (5K Run Fund) used to benefit nonprofit agencies in the community, contributions from the City of Memphis to enhance a witness protection program (Witness Relocation Fund), and donations received from various groups to promote initiatives to increase the quality of life in certain communities located in Shelby County (Broken Window Fund).

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The various governmental funds are accounted for using the modified accrual basis of accounting.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

SCOPE

The reviews include an examination of funds administered by the district attorneys general for the year ended June 30, 2005. In addition, the reviews include an examination of the administration of judicial district drug task force funds by the Drug Task Forces' Boards of Directors for the year ended June 30, 2005. Our reviews consisted of tests of records and auditing procedures that we considered necessary in the circumstances.

Findings and recommendations, as a result of our reviews, are presented in the Findings, Recommendations, and Financial Section of this report. Ten judicial districts had material findings. We reviewed these findings and recommendations with the district attorneys general and representatives of the Drug Task Forces to provide an opportunity for their response. The written responses from the District Attorneys General of the Third and Twenty-Second Judicial Districts and the director of the Tenth Judicial District Drug Task Force are included in this report. Other officials made oral responses, however these oral responses have not been included in this report.

FINDINGS, RECOMMENDATIONS AND FINANCIAL SECTION

FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

FINDING 05.01 THE DRUG TASK FORCE DID NOT DEPOSIT COLLECTIONS WITH THE COUNTY TRUSTEE WITHIN THREE DAYS OF RECEIPT

Drug Task Force (DTF) policy is to deposit all collections, including all seized funds, with the county trustee. Section 5-8-207, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, requires officials to deposit all receipts within three days of collection. The DTF did not deposit all of these collections with the county trustee within three days of receipt.

RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force should deposit all collections with the county trustee within three days of receipt as required by state statute.

FINDING 05.02 AGENTS' ACTIVITY REPORTS WERE NOT SIGNED AS EVIDENCE OF REVIEW AND APPROVAL

Individual agents did not always sign their activity reports for confidential funds. These reports are used to document the disbursement of confidential funds by the individual agents and should be signed by the agent as evidence that the reports are complete and accurate. Also, the Drug Task Force director did not always sign the agents' reports as evidence of supervisory review and approval.

RECOMMENDATION

To strengthen internal controls, the agents' activity reports for confidential funds should be signed by the individual agent to document that the reports are complete and accurate. Likewise, the director, or his designee, should sign the agents' activity reports as evidence of supervisory review and approval.

The Drug Task Force (DTF) policy is to deposit all collections, including all seized funds, with the county trustee. In some instances, the DTF did not deposit funds with the trustee within three days of collection. For example, a collection of \$500 receipted on June 24, 2005, was not remitted to the trustee until April 12, 2006, after we inquired about the disposition of the funds. Section 5-8-207, Tennessee Code Annotated, requires funds to be deposited within three days of collection.

RECOMMENDATION

The DTF should deposit all funds with the county trustee within three days of collection as required by state statute.

FINDING 05.01 COMPENSATION WAS PAID DIRECTLY TO A STATE EMPLOYEE RATHER THAN FORWARDING THE AMOUNTS TO THE DISTRICT ATTORNEYS' GENERAL CONFERENCE

Compensation was paid bi-monthly to an employee of the District Attorney General's Office for network support services performed for the Judicial District Drug Task Force. This compensation was paid directly from the Judicial District Drug Fund rather than forwarding the amounts to the District Attorneys' General Conference for payment through its payroll system. Also, no payroll taxes were withheld or paid on the compensation.

RECOMMENDATION

All funds to supplement an employee's compensation should be forwarded to the employee's employer for payment through its payroll system with applicable payroll taxes reported.

TENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

FINDING 05.01 A CASH SHORTAGE OF \$4,520 EXISTED IN THE JUDICIAL DISTRICT DRUG FUND

The Drug Task Force (DTF) could not account for \$3,200 of cash being held as evidence and \$1,320 of confidential investigative funds, resulting in a cash shortage of \$4,520. During our annual examination of the Tenth Judicial District, the DTF director informed auditors that in October 2005, she was unable to reconcile cash stored in the vault for confidential investigative work with the log maintained to document the use of these funds. She also determined that she could not account for cash being held in the vault as evidence. Upon discovering these discrepancies, the DTF director contacted the Tenth Judicial District Attorney General's Office, and the case was referred to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation. However, the Comptroller's Office was not notified of these discrepancies until we arrived to perform our annual review.

As a result of this information provided by the DTF director, we extended our procedures to include a review of cash activity for the period July 1, 2005, through March 15, 2006. Our extended examination confirmed that funds were unaccounted for in four instances of cash held as evidence totaling \$3,200 and confidential investigative funds totaling \$1,320.

The following table summarizes seized cash that is not accounted for and was held as evidence and recorded on the log maintained by the director:

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RECOMMENDATION

Officials should proceed with the investigation and liquidate the cash shortage. Also, the Comptroller's Office should be notified immediately of any potential cash shortages.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DRUG TASK FORCE DIRECTOR

I agree with this finding. I was not aware I was supposed to contact the Comptroller's Office of any discrepancies. Should anything like this ever happen in the future, I will notify your office.

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FINDING 05.02 THE DRUG TASK FORCE HAD ACCOUNTING DEFICIENCIES

The following accounting deficiencies were noted:

- A. Official receipts were not issued for all collections as required by Section 9-2-103, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>. Receipts were only issued for the collections of cash.
- B. Cash held as evidence was maintained in the vault for extended periods of time instead of being deposited. This practice increases the risks that cash will be lost or stolen.
- C. The cash maintained in the vault to replenish the agents' confidential investigative funds was not routinely counted and reconciled by the director with the log maintained to account for these funds.
- D. The Drug Task Force (DTF) director had agents present their confidential investigative cash twice a month and compared the cash presented to the amount of cash reflected on the agents' activity logs. However, our procedures revealed that the agents' activity logs did not accurately reflect all of the agents' transactions.
- E. The DTF director transferred \$3,410 in November 2004 from cash that was held as evidence to confidential investigative funds instead of remitting the funds to the McMinn County Finance Office and then requesting additional funds from McMinn County for confidential transactions.
- F. During the period October 2004 through February 2006, funds received as contributions (\$2,300) as well as some interest earnings (\$1,906) from a seizure checking account were deposited to a checking account maintained by the DTF director instead of being remitted to the McMinn County Finance Office. During this period, the DTF director disbursed \$1,672 from this account to purchase equipment and other items for use by the reserve officers. After this issue was discussed with the DTF director, she remitted the interest earnings of \$1,906 to the McMinn County Finance Office.

RECOMMENDATION

Receipts should be written for all collections as required by state statute. The DTF Board of Directors should review their policies related to cash held for evidence in order to ensure that cash is deposited to a bank account unless required for prosecution. Cash maintained by the director to replenish the agents' confidential funds should be periodically counted and reconciled with the log of these transactions. The director should perform a detailed review of the agents' activity logs every two weeks to ensure that the logs accurately reflect the agents' confidential transactions. Cash held as evidence should be remitted to the McMinn County Finance Office once the case has been disposed, and any funds needed for confidential transactions should be requested from the McMinn County Finance Office. All non-confidential transactions should be channeled through the Judicial District Drug Task Force Fund maintained by the McMinn County Finance Office.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE - DRUG TASK FORCE DIRECTOR

- A. I had been told by auditors to issue receipts for any cash received which we did. It was not until this audit that I was advised to write receipts for checks received. In the future, we will write receipts for all collections.
- B. The cash held in the vault is for cases pending in court. Court cases can be held for years before being resolved. Recently the State District Attorney's Office said we did not have to hold this money for trial. However, monies being held in federal courts will have to remain in evidence until the cases are disposed of in court. These monies will be remanded to the finance department when they can be released.
- C. I agree with this statement. I did not count the director's funds as needed.
- D. I agree with this statement. I will closely monitor the agents' activity logs.
- E. Auditors reviewed and approved this procedure during the 2004 audit; however, this year it was questioned.
- F. These funds do not belong to the Drug Task Force. They are Bradley County Reserve funds. The reserves have since taken control of these funds.

AUDITOR'S REBUTTAL

- A. Section 9-2-103, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, requires receipts to be issued for all collections.
- E. To strengthen internal control and provide a detailed audit trail, cash held as evidence should be remitted to the McMinn County Finance Office once the case has been disposed. Any funds needed for confidential transactions should be requested from the McMinn County Finance Office.

TWELFTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

FINDING 05.01 DEFICIENCIES WERE NOTED IN DRUG TASK FORCE EXPENDITURES

Our examination revealed the following deficiencies in Drug Task Force (DTF) expenditures:

- A. Original documentation was not on file at the County Mayor's Office to support all expenditures charged to DTF credit cards. These expenditures included charges for supplies, gasoline, Internet services, lodging, and meals. We extended our examination to determine that these goods and/or services were received.
- B. DTF funds were used to pay the monthly cellular telephone bills for an assistant district attorney. Since these expenditures were primarily for the benefit of the District Attorney's Office, we questioned the propriety of paying these expenditures with DTF funds. Chapter VI, Page 1, of the Tennessee Administrative Manual subrecipients, Byrne Formula Grants, states that purchases are to be made for the subrecipient's operation. Also, Section 39-17-420(c), Tennessee Code Annotated (TCA), states that all fines and forfeitures placed in the Drug Task Force Fund "shall be used exclusively for a drug enforcement or drug education program of the district." If the equipment and/or supplies purchased are used for both DTF and non-task force activities, the cost of the equipment should be allocated appropriately.

RECOMMENDATION

The DTF should file detailed invoices to support all expenditures, and should make disbursements only for drug enforcement or drug education programs, as required by Byrne Formula Grant regulations and Section 39-17-420(c), <u>TCA</u>. If equipment and/or supplies are used for both DTF and non-task force activities, the cost of the equipment and/or supplies should be appropriately allocated.

FINDING 05.02 SEVERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES DID NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE DRUG TASK FORCE

During the year, the Sequatchie County Sheriff's Department was the only agency to contribute to the operations of the Drug Task Force (DTF). The Twelfth Judicial District DTF was established in 1988 by an interlocal agreement among 27 law enforcement agencies within the district. This agreement provided that each agency would support the efforts of the drug task force with financial, equipment, and/or manpower contributions.

RECOMMENDATION

The law enforcement agencies within the judicial district should review their participation in the DTF, and agencies that do not wish to participate should withdraw from the interlocal agreement.

FINDING 05.03 THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS DID NOT ASSUME SUFFICIENT OVERSIGHT RESPONSIBILITY

The Board of Directors of the Drug Task Force (DTF) did not assume sufficient oversight responsibility for the DTF's operations. During the year examined, the board held one meeting, and only five of the 27 participating law enforcement agencies included in the interlocal agreement attended. One meeting was not sufficient to review and approve all of the task force's operations.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board of Directors should meet regularly to approve and review the DTF's operations, including expenditures, personnel policies, controls over evidence and confiscations, and the status of cases. Minutes of these meeting should be documented and maintained on file.

FINDING 05.04 PAYMENTS TO CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANTS WERE NOT WITNESSED BY A SECOND OFFICER

Receipts for payments to confidential informants reflected the signature of only one officer. Bureau of Justice Guidelines require that two officers witness payments to confidential informants.

RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force director should require documentation that two officers witness payments to confidential informants as required by Bureau of Justice guidelines.

THIRTEENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

FINDING 05.01 THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE HAD INADEQUATE CONTROLS OVER INVENTORY

The District Attorney General's Office did not maintain adequate controls over assets purchased with District Attorney General funds. Inventory records of assets owned by the District Attorney General's Office were maintained; however, we noted several assets on the inventory that were not tagged or clearly marked as office property. Failure to properly tag or mark assets as office property weakens control over assets.

RECOMMENDATION

To improve controls over inventory, the District Attorney General's Office should tag or clearly mark all assets as office property.

FINDING 05.02 DEFICIENCIES WERE NOTED IN THE DRUG TASK FORCE'S PURCHASING PROCEDURES

The Putnam County Executive administers purchasing for the Judicial District Drug Task Force Fund; therefore, the purchasing procedures are those adopted by Putnam County, Tennessee. We noted the following deficiencies in purchasing procedures during our examination of the Judicial District Drug Task Force Fund:

- A. The office did not issue purchase orders for some applicable purchases. Purchase orders are necessary to control who has purchasing authority for the Judicial District Drug Task Force Fund and to document purchasing commitments.
- B. Competitive bids were not solicited for the design and printing of 100,000 methamphetamine drug education handbooks (\$67,295) or for protective gear and equipment (\$32,835). Purchasing procedures for the Putnam County Executive's Office are governed by provisions of Chapter 63, Private Acts of 1981. This statute requires all purchases exceeding \$5,000 to be made on the basis of competitive bids solicited through advertisement in a local newspaper.

RECOMMENDATION

The office should issue purchase orders for all applicable purchases, and purchases exceeding \$5,000 should be competitively bid as required by Putnam County's private act.

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FINDING 05.03 THE DRUG TASK FORCE HAD INVENTORY CONTROL DEFICIENCIES

We noted the following inventory control deficiencies:

- A. The Drug Task Force (DTF) maintained an equipment inventory. However, several assets in the nonconfidential operations of the DTF purchased with grant funds were not tagged or otherwise clearly identified as DTF property. In addition, some inventory records did not contain sufficient information such as the asset's serial number or other form of identification that would allow the asset to be physically inspected and reconciled with the inventory record. Generally accepted accounting principles require accountability for all DTF-owned assets, such as equipment, furniture, and vehicles. If assets are not identified as DTF property, the organization's inventory controls are weakened.
- B. Auditors were unable to verify the existence of six Motorola portable radios, a Nordic Rider exercise machine, a night vision scope, and a printer listed on the equipment inventory.

RECOMMENDATION

All assets should be tagged or otherwise identified as DTF property. Also, inventory records should include specific identification, such as serial numbers, to allow assets to be periodically verified by personnel independent of maintaining these records. Officials should take steps to account for items listed on the inventory that could not be located.

FINDING 05.04 THE DRUG TASK FORCE DID NOT MONITOR A SUBRECIPIENT OF FEDERAL AWARDS

The Methamphetamine Initiative Grant's approved budget included a pass-through amount of \$14,000 for the Cookeville Police Department, a grant subrecipient. The Drug Task Force (DTF) did not monitor the subrecipient's use of these federal funds to ensure that the awards were used for authorized purposes in compliance with laws, regulations, and provisions of contracts or grant agreements as required by OMB Circular A-133. Since the DTF did not comply with the monitoring requirements of OMB Circular A-133, the entire pass-through amount of \$14,000 is considered a questioned cost.

RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force should monitor subrecipients to ensure the federal awards were used for authorized purposes as required by federal grant regulations.

FINDING 05.01 PAYMENTS TO CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANTS WERE NOT ALWAYS WITNESSED BY A SECOND OFFICER

Some receipts for payments to confidential informants were not signed by the agent, a witness, or the informant. The Bureau of Justice Guidelines require that two agents witness payments to confidential informants.

RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force director should require the signature of two officers for all payments to confidential informants.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

The agents will have the confidential informant sign the receipt, and then both agents working the case will sign the receipt.

FINDING 05.02 THE DRUG TASK FORCE COULD NOT ACCOUNT FOR SEVERAL PIECES OF EQUIPMENT

The Drug Task Force could not account for 27 pieces of equipment listed on the prior-year equipment inventory that were not listed on the current year inventory. Some of the unaccounted items included: a pager, four radios, two radio chargers, two tape recorders, a Minolta camera, a radar system, a night vision scope, a video camera, and various tools.

RECOMMENDATION

Internal controls over equipment should be strengthened. An annual inventory of equipment should be prepared and compared with the prior-year inventory. Any differences should be investigated and explained.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL

The Drug Task Force has done a complete inventory of equipment. Most of our equipment is outdated and/or non-functioning, and some pieces were disposed of without proper documentation. From this point forward, there will be an explanation for any equipment not on the current inventory listing.

FINDING 05.01 THE DRUG TASK FORCE DID NOT DEPOSIT ALL FORFEITED FUNDS WITH THE COUNTY TRUSTEE

The Drug Task Force did not deposit, with the county trustee, seized funds that had been forfeited to the task force by the Department of Safety.

RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force should deposit with the county trustee on a current basis all seized funds that have been forfeited to the task force.

FINDING 05.02 THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS DID NOT ASSUME OVERSIGHT RESPONSIBILITY

The Drug Task Force's (DTF) Board of Directors did not assume oversight responsibility for the task force's operations. The board held only two meetings in 2005. Two meetings were not sufficient to review and approve all the task force's operations. Furthermore, auditors could not determine if the board had approved the DTF's budget and employee salaries.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board of Directors should meet regularly to approve and review the DTF's operations, including expenditures, personnel policies, controls over evidence, confiscations, and the status of cases. Minutes of these meetings should be documented and maintained on file.

FINDING 05.01 DRUG TASK FORCE FUNDS WERE NOT USED IN COMPLIANCE WITH STATE STATUTE

The Drug Task Force (DTF) expended \$2,170 for training and travel for the district attorney general relating to the investigation and prosecution of drug and violent crimes. In addition, the DTF paid for monthly cellular telephone service for the district attorney general and three assistants during the year. Section 39-17-420(c), Tennessee Code Annotated, provides that all drug fines and forfeitures the DTF receives be used, "...exclusively in a drug enforcement or drug education program of the district" Therefore, the use of DTF funds to pay for training, travel, and cell telephones that are not used exclusively for drug enforcement and drug education is questionable. If the expenditure benefits both task force and non-task force activities, the costs should be allocated appropriately.

RECOMMENDATION

DTF disbursements from drug fines and forfeitures should be used only for drug enforcement or drug education as required by state statute.
