Pam Belew CLERK**AGREED ORDER & MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

This cause came on to be heard on the 27th day of MAY, 2004, before the Honorable William B. Acree, Jr., Circuit Judge, and it appeared to the Court, that the defendant having waived her right to a speedy trial, that the State of Tennessee and counsel for the defendant agree that defendant should participate in the Pretrial Diversion Program and that this case should be continued for a period of 2 years, at which time the charge against the defendant can be dismissed if she successfully completes the program and the conditions of the following Memorandum of Understanding:

1. Refrain from any violation of the law and any conduct contrary to good citizenship.
2. Cooperate with the Pretrial Diversion Probation Officers.
3. Successfully complete the Pretrial Diversion Program.
4. Complete 100 hours of community service work.
5. Pay the courts costs. \$460.50 w/in 30 days
6. Pay \$40.00 per month supervision fee.
7. Report to the Probation Officer on this date to receive the rules of probation.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the case against the defendant, TERESA JOHNSON, be continued for a period of 2 years, in order that she might participate in the Pretrial Diversion Program, and at the expiration of the probationary period and successful completion of the Pretrial Diversion, the Defendant may petition the Court for expungement of her records.


