Weakley County Receives Clean Audit Report

The Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury is recognizing a significant achievement by Weakley County government leaders and elected officials.

Weakley County's audit report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015 contains no audit findings. A small number of Tennessee counties can claim this distinction.

Weakley County government has come very close to having a clean audit for several years. For the past two fiscal years, the county has had only one finding on its audit reports. Leaders have made a commitment to identify and reduce risk through a strong system of internal controls.

"This audit report is as good as it gets," Comptroller Justin P. Wilson said. "I applaud everyone in Weakley County government who has worked hard to have one of the strongest systems of county government in the state."

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office audits 89 of Tennessee's 95 counties. Last year only two of the 89 counties (Hamblen and Robertson) received clean audit reports. Weakley County joins Sullivan County, Blount County and Tipton County as the only counties who have received clean reports in fiscal year 2015, so far. County audit reports will continue to be released through March.
