V. Subcommittee Report Out

Nuclear Energy -- Current environment and possible options for the council and state to consider:

- New large scale nuclear plants are not expected in the near term.
- Smaller LWRs and advanced reactors are emerging power options that could offer opportunities for Tennessee businesses.
- Opportunities for the state involvement includes participating in modernizing the nuclear supply chain, host reactor demonstrations, leverage current interest in medical isotope production, tie these activities together with the Tennessee higher education system and leverage federal programs.

Electric Transportation -- Recommendations and funding opportunities:

- Recommend the council support the work that is already going on by the state and TVA.
- Reviewed the Drive Electric effort and suggested looking at the work already being don and see if there are any gaps.
- Questions the group should ask:
 - What are the funding opportunities (state, TVA, and other groups)?
 - Is this effort funded adequately and timing accurate?
 - Is there appropriate state involvement?

Fuel Source Diversification -- Recommendations on focus areas:

- Facilitate alternative fuel fleet vehicle upgrades -- considerations in financial support such as revolving zero interest loan programs and a simple policy structure.
- Increase supply -- energy policy considerations for natural gas infrastructure that face such challenges as availability, reliability, and regulations.
- Balanced energy mix for environmental and economic benefit.
