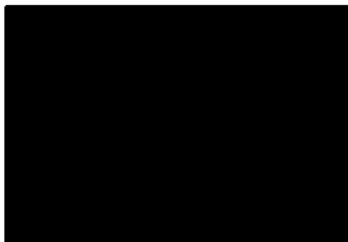

THE GRAND JURORS of McNairy County, Tennessee, duly empaneled and sworn, upon their oath, present that **JOHN C. PARKER, JR**, on a date between September 1, 2025, and November 30, 2025, in McNairy County, Tennessee, and before the finding of this indictment, did unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly, by the use of a credit card issued by American Express to the Town of Selmer, No. XXXX-XXXXX2-61097, obtain household goods, valued less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), from Wal Mart; the said John C. Parker, Jr., knowing at the time that the use of the aforesaid credit card was not authorized by the Town of Selmer, in violation of T.C.A. 39-14-118, against the peace and dignity of the State of Tennessee.

COUNT TWO

And the Grand Jurors on their oath aforesaid further present that in McNairy County on a date between September 1, 2025, and November 30, 2025, before the finding of this indictment, the said **JOHN C. PARKER, JR**, did unlawfully and knowingly obtain property, to-wit: household goods, a more particular description thereof being to the Grand Jurors unknown, valued less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), of the Town of Selmer, without its effective consent, with the intent to deprive the Town of Selmer thereof, in violation of T.C.A. 39-14-103, against the peace and dignity of the State of Tennessee.

COUNT THREE

And the Grand Jurors on their oath aforesaid further present that in McNairy County on a date between September 1, 2025, and November 30, 2025, before the finding of this indictment, the said **JOHN C. PARKER, JR.**, did unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly, while a public servant, to-wit: Street and Sanitation Department Superintendent, with intent to obtain a benefit, did receive a benefit, to-wit: household goods, not otherwise authorized by law, in violation of T.C.A. 39-16-402, against the peace and dignity of the State of Tennessee.
