INVESTIGATIVE REPORT

Town of Selmer Street and Sanitation Department

The Office of the Comptroller of the Treasury investigated allegations of malfeasance related to the Town of Selmer Street and Sanitation Department. The investigation was initiated after the Office of the Comptroller received allegations that the town’s Street and Sanitation Department Superintendent made unauthorized transactions using his town-issued credit card. The investigation was limited to selected records for the period September 1, 2025, through November 30, 2025. The results of the investigation were communicated with the Office of the District Attorney General of the 25th Judicial District.

BACKGROUND



The Town of Selmer (town) is located in McNairy County, and it is the county seat, with a population of 4,488 residents. The town operates several departments to manage public safety, infrastructure, and community services. The town’s Street and Sanitation Department oversees road maintenance, waste collection, and general town cleanliness.

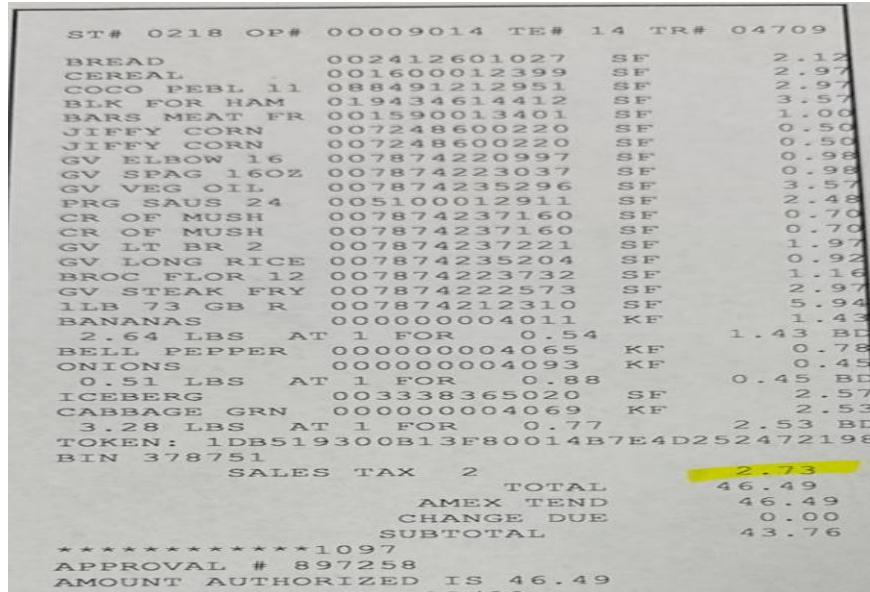
John Parker, Jr. was hired as the town’s Street and Sanitation Department (department) Superintendent on September 9, 2025. He maintained that position until December 9, 2025, when his employment was terminated by the town’s board during the December board meeting after he admitted to using the town’s issued credit card for personal use.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

1. FORMER TOWN OF SELMER STREET AND SANITATION DEPARTMENT SUPERINTENDENT JOHN PARKER, JR. MISAPPROPRIATED AT LEAST \$185.66

Former department superintendent John Parker, Jr. misappropriated at least \$185.66 from the town. During the investigative period, Parker made three unauthorized purchases at Walmart using his town-issued American Express credit card. The transactions occurred on October 25, November 2, and November 9, 2025. Receipts show the purchases consisted of food items, including eggs, bread, lunch meat, peanut butter, cereal, and vegetables (**Refer to Exhibit 1**).

At the December 9, 2025 board meeting, Parker stated to board members that he misused the credit card more than once for personal reasons.

On June 15, 2026, the McNairy County Grand Jury indicted John Parker, Jr. on one count of Theft of Property under \$1,000, one count of Fraudulent Use of a Credit Card, and one count of Official Misconduct.

The charges and allegations contained in the indictment are merely accusations of criminal conduct, and not evidence. The defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt and convicted through due process of law.
