#### TENNESSEE LOCAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY October 19, 2020

Pursuant to the provisions of Executive Order 16, as amended by Executive Order 34, and further amended by Executive Order 60, the Tennessee Local Development Authority (the "Authority" or "TLDA") met on Monday, October 19, 2020, at 3:20 p.m. via WebEx Events with certain members being physically present in the Executive Conference Room, Ground Floor, State Capitol, Nashville, Tennessee. Interested members of the public were only able to observe and listen to the meeting through electronic means. The Honorable Tre Hargett, Secretary of State, was present and presided over the meeting.

Mr. Hargett called the meeting to order, and asked Ms. Sandi Thompson, TLDA Assistant Secretary and the Director of the Division of State Government Finance (DSGF) to conduct a roll-call:

Recognizing a quorum present, Mr. Hargett read the following statement:

"Governor Bill Lee, a member of this entity, has previously declared a state of emergency to facilitate Tennessee's response to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). His Executive Order No. 16, as amended by Executive Order No. 34, and further amended by Executive Order No. 60, allows governing bodies to meet electronically regarding essential business in light of COVID-19, so long as they provided electronic access to the public and met certain safeguards established in that Order to ensure the openness and transparency of the proceedings. In the Notice for this meeting, we indicated the meeting would be held in the Executive Conference Room of the State Capitol, which is currently closed to the public, as well as conducted through WebEx Events and provided information and the steps for public electronic participation. At this time we need a motion to make a determination pursuant to the provisions of Executive Order 16, as amended, that meeting electronically and electronic access is necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of Tennesseans in light of the COVID-19 outbreak and the matters listed on the agenda for this meeting relate to the essential business of this board and the necessary safeguards have been taken."

Mr. Hargett made a motion to approve the necessity pursuant to Executive Order 16, and Mr. Eley seconded the motion. Mr. Hargett called upon Ms. Thompson to conduct a roll-call vote:

The motion carried to conduct the TLDA meeting in this manner.

Mr. Hargett stated that the first item on the agenda was approval of the minutes from the September 21, 2020 TLDA meeting. Mr. Wilson made a motion to approve the minutes, and Mr. Eley seconded the motion. Mr. Hargett called upon Ms. Thompson to conduct a roll-call vote:

The minutes were unanimously approved.

Mr. Hargett stated that the next item was a report on the notification received from the City of Crossville submitted to comply with *TLDA SRF Policy and Guidance for Borrowers*. He called upon Ms. Thompson to present the report. Ms. Thompson stated that the City of Crossville was required to notify and had submitted notification to the TLDA that it was proposing to issue a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) bond in order to finance water and sewer improvements and extensions. She stated that the bonds would be secured with a pledge of the City's water and sewer revenues and that it would be subordinate to the pledge of revenues in favor of the City's outstanding SRF loans. Ms. Thompson stated that this was a report item only. No further action was required by the board. Mr. Hargett asked if there was any discussion. Hearing none, and with no further action necessary, he moved on to the next agenda item.

Mr. Hargett stated that the next item on the agenda was a Resolution of Appreciation to Dr. Kenneth Moore. He inquired if the the Resolution was included in the meeting packet, and Ms. Thompson responded affirmatively. Mr. Hargett stated that the TLDA was grateful to Dr. Moore for his great service to the board. He further stated that he had enjoyed working with Dr. Moore, as well as his professionalism and the wonderful amount of experience he brought to the TLDA as would his successor, Mayor Paige Brown. Mr. Hargett stated that the TLDA looked forward to her distinguished service as well.

### Hallsdale-Powell Utility District Request for TLDA Approval to Issue Additional Debt

The Hallsdale-Powell Utility District (the "District") is requesting approval from the Tennessee Local Development Authority (the "Authority" or "TLDA") to issue USDA Rural Development Bonds. The proposed Bonds will be issued in an amount not to exceed \$21,841,100.

A formal request to the TLDA for approval is required by provisions set forth in the State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan agreement and guidelines set forth in the *TLDA/SRF Policy and Guidance for Borrowers*.

#### 4. Description and Additional Information:

The Bonds will be issued to fund improvements to its sewer system. The bonds are proposed to be issued in one or more series, with the term of each not to exceed 40 years with essentially level monthly payments. The rate will be determined at the time of issuance but the current estimate of 2.125% (based on Rural Development commitment to loan at a rate not to exceed the quoted rate) is being used for planning purposes. These bonds are proposed to be issued as junior lien bonds under HPUD's Master Resolution, as amended and supplemented and junior to the liens granted for HPUD's outstanding SRF loans and other outstanding indebtedness secured by liens on the net revenues of HPUD's system under the Master Resolution.

At March 31, 2019, the District reported \$16,129,899 in unrestricted cash and \$47,590,122 in restricted cash and investments.

Dear Ms. Thompson:

I am writing this on behalf of Hallsdale-Powell Utility District ("HPUD") to request that the Tennessee Local Development Authority ("TLDA") consider approval of HPUD's issuance of additional indebtedness as hereinafter described. Specifically, HPUD requests approval by TLDA of HPUD's proposed issuance of the indebtedness described below at TLDA's next scheduled meeting.

This request is for TLDA's consent to HPUD's issuance of up to \$21,841,100 for improvements to its water system. These bonds are proposed to be issued in one or more series, with the term of each not to exceed 40 years with essentially level monthly payments. The rate for the first series of bonds to be issued will be determined at the time of issuance but the current estimate of 2.125% (based on Rural Development commitment to loan at such rate for such bonds provided the closing occurs on or before December 31, 2020) is being used for planning purposes. These bonds are proposed to be issued as junior lien bonds under HPUD's Master Resolution, as amended and supplemented and junior to the liens granted for HPUD's outstanding SRF loans and other outstanding indebtedness secured by liens on the net revenues of HPUD's system under the Master Resolution. We would therefore request TLDA's approval of the issuance of up to \$21,841,100 of bonds for water related improvements to be issued with the financing being provided by Rural Development, subordinate in lien position to outstanding SRF indebtedness. Earlier today I emailed to your office certain historical and pro forma debt service coverage calculations which you are welcome to include in any information package distributed to staff or TLDA Board members.
